#### **DETAIL ITINERARY**



# Day 1 Hanoi

Get a feel for this charming city on a cyclo ride through the Old Quarter. With its wide boulevards and yellow painted buildings, the city centre still retains an air of a provincial French town of the 1930s.

# Days 2-3 Halong Bay Junk return overnight, to Hanoi

Rest your eyes on the azure waters of this magical bay, where thousands of sculpted limestone islands rise magestically from the waves. Aboard a sailing junk visit some of the islands and caves, take a pre-dinner swim and enjoy a a very peaceful night beneath the stars.

# Days 4-5 Hue

Surrounded by mountains and sea, Hue was chosen as capital by the Nguyen emperors for its natural beauty and isolation. The royal past lives on in the atmospheric ruins of the Imperial Citadel and the emperors' magnificent tombs





# Days 6-7 Hoi An

Head south through the spectacular scenery of buffalo-dotted rice paddies, endless lagoons and breathtaking mountain passes to Hoi An. once known as Faifo, was an important trading town with strong south Chinese influence and connections

# Day 8 Sai Gon (Ho Chi Minh City)

Get acquainted with the city on a cyclo tour and choose from an endless array of eating options, from a local style lunch in the Ben Thanh Market to fine dining and outdoor barbecue.

# Days 9-10 Mekong Delta Homestay and Cu Chi Tunnels

The 'rice bowl' of Vietnam is famous for its tropical fruits and flowers - and of course rice. Cruise among floating markets and visit some cottage industries by boat through the maze of waterways. Mix with the locals on an overnight homestay and crawl down the famous Cu Chi Tunnels

# Day 11 Sai Gon

Vietnam's lively city is the perfect place to unwind from our trip. Wander the Dong Khoi avenue, while the hours away on rooftop bars or browse the city's markets before a final meal.





## INTRODUCTION

Just next to the famous Ha Long Bay, a world natural heritage, Bai Tu Long Bay is not any the less beautiful with hundreds of islets rising from the clear water and long smooth sand banks.

After admiring the beauty of the limestone rocks in numerous interesting shapes and discovering deep caves or mangrove forests by boat, visitors still have much more to see on Quan Lan Island with pristine beauty featuring unspoiled environment. The deep blue sea has strong waves and white sand beaches, which span over several kilometers. Some distance away from the beach stand the very green wild pines, further add to its original charm.





## **DETAIL ITINERARY**

# Day 1 Hanoi – Ha long bay – Quan Lan island

This morning you will be picked up from the hotel, then take an airconditioned bus to Halong City. Arriving in Ha Long City, you will have time for lunch (included) in a local restaurant before boarding the ferry to Quan Lan Island. On board the ferry you will have the opportunity to take in the breathtaking scenery of Bai Tu Long Bay during the 4½ hour journey. Arriving at Quan Lan Island, a Vietnamese tuk-tuk will take you to your bungalow on the beach. It is then free time to chill, read, or take a walk along the beach.

**Note** :You can book a private boat (140 usd) to visit the caves and have lunch on boat

# Day 2 Quan Lan

Today is a free day to chill out and relax. A popular option is to hire a bicycle and take a photographic trip around the Island, which will allow you to glimpse the remoteness and untouched scenery that was Vietnam before wide-scale tourism made its impact.



# Day 3 Quan Lan - Cai Rong

Early this morning you will take a local ferry to Cai Rong Island, about 3 hours from Quan Lan. Take time to see some beauty spots on the island like Van Don harbour (Vietnam's oldest trade harbour), Cai Rong town market, Hang Doi (Bat Cave) and especially the Cua Ong Temple. Overnight in Cai Rong

# Day 4 Cai Rong- Hanoi

After breakfast our car will come to pick you up from the hotel for a 4 hour drive to Hanoi





Day 1: Overnight train to Sapa
In the evening our guide picks you up
from the hotel. Transfer to railway station
for a 10 hour night train to Sapa

#### Day 2: Sapa

We are met on arrival into Lao Cao in the early morning and transferred to Sapa by minibus, driving through dramatic and breathtaking scenery. The remainder of your day is at leisure to explore this fascinating town. You can take some exercise with a walk to Cat Cat village, set in a beautiful valley just outside Sapa. Cat Cat is home to the H'mong people who originated from China about 3000 years ago. The H'mong people are easily recognisable by their dark blue or black clothing. The dye is made from the indigo plant which is native to the area. H'mong women wear long aprons with embroidered waistcoats and have their hair rolled up into a turban-like hat, while the men wear a black skullcap, long waistcoat and loose trousers.

As you walk to the village nestled in the valley below Sapa, you will meet some of the local minority people on their way to and from Sapa. These minority people walk to Sapa to trade at the markets – always an exciting place. As well as the H'mong, you can expect to see the Dao (pronounced Zao). Dao women are particularly striking as they wear a large red turban often covered with old coins or jewellery, and shave their hair and eyebrows.

# Day 3 Sapa Trek- Ta Van homestay


Following breakfast you embark on a six hour trek which takes you along buffalo paths and trails and through several hilltribe villages. This is an absolutely spectacular walk through stunning scenery inhabited by some of the friendliest people you can hope to meet. Stopping for a picnic lunch along the way, you spend the night with a family in Ta Van Village, inhabited by the Zay people. These people have become very adept at rice cultivation, in marked contrast to the H'mong, and have a higher living standard as a result.



# Day 4 Giang Ta Chai - Sapa, Overnight train back to Ha Noi

After breakfast, you set off for a two hour walk to Giang Ta Chai village where you meet up with your vehicle to take you back to Sapa town. Arriving back in Sapa around lunchtime, you have a free afternoon to further explore the town before your transfer to the train station for the night train to Hanoi.





# 9 days

Northeast Vietnam is a destination most tourists who go to Vietnam do not visit. It is really a pity, because sceneries here are fabulous. In some of the places, tourism is still very scarce. These areas offer breathtaking views and interesting subcultures. The legendary lake of Ba Be surrounded by primeval forest, the scenic Ban Gioc Waterfall, the historical Pac Po Cave...all exposed to your sight.

This trip takes you through a stunning and isolated area which has changed little over the centuries and is steeped in history. You will not only experience rural Vietnam behind the scenes but also meet numerous different ethnic minority groups who are only too pleased to let you into their world.

# Days 1-3 Ha Giang

located at the highest latitude in Vietnam, the politically sensitive Ha Giang shares its borders with Vietnam's arch-enemy China – here one gets the feeling of touching the sky. And the infamous Vuong Palace - a H'mong high-rank family during the French rule - with its wonderful style of architecture

# Days 4-5 Ba Be lakes

The legendary lake of Ba Be is just one continuous water body although the name means three lakes?. Embarking on a boat cruise down the Nang River which is the main water source of the lake will bring a taste of the tranquil countryside and an enjoyable exploration of the Ba Be National Park.





# Days 6-7 Cao Bang - Ban Gioc Waterfalls

One of the most beautiful waterfalls in Vietnam, which form a natural border between Vietnam and China. The echo of the falls can be heard kilometers away. In rainy season, the waterfall makes the scenery even more magnificent. Take a bamboo raft trip and have a chance to visit China on the other river bank.

# Day 8-9 Lang Son, return to Ha Noi

Being the capital of this mountainous area, this border town had been all destroyed during the recent Sino - Vietnamese war, but was rebuilt to become an important trade center. Everything can be found from electronics and gadgets to textiles and house wares. Its definitely buyer be aware, as there's lots of knock-offs of the original.



Cuc Phuong, the biggest and the most diverse National Park in Vietnam with a huge variety of rare fauna and flora in the limestone mountain forest. The endangered Primates Rescued Centre is a perfect place to see many kinds of rare primates such as Langur, Gibbon and Loris all over Vietnam, many of them are under threat of extinction.

Phat Diem Cathedral – the Center of Catholicism in North Vietnam - was built in 1891 with four roofs and six sets of iron wooden pillars. On both sides of the church are four smaller churches of different styles. The boat trip in Tam Coc is another opportunity to contemplate the beautiful countryside scenery of Vietnam and see the daily life on water of the Vietnamese in this region.





# DETAIL ITINERARY Day1: Hanoi - Phat Diem - Tam Coc

Our trip kicks off with an early start from Hanoi, a 2 hour drive will take you to the rural town of Ninh Binh, which is located in one of the most beautiful parts of Vietnam, with its dramatic scenery, historical intrigues, religious pilgrimage sites and endangered animal sanctuaries. The town of Ninh Binh is an ideal base to venture out on short small day trips. En route we will stop at the centuries old brick kilns, a war memorial, picturesque rice fields... We will then continue on to the town of Kim Son to visit Phat Diem Cathedral, the centre of Vietnamese Catholicism, we will take a guided tour around the immense 19th century stone cathedral. We will also visit a factory where villagers produce handicrafts for the churchgoers, then return to Ninh Binh.

Arriving in Ninh Binh, you will have a chance to visit Tam Coc (Three Caves) travelling through Ninh Binh's rice fields which have earned nickname Halong Bay without water, a moniker borne out by the limestone karsts which dominate the landscape. You will take a boat to and through the caves, past spectacular cliffs, liliputian villages, and remote farming communities.

The restaurants around Tam Coc are a special way to enjoy some local food specialties. After lunch, the guide will assist you with your bicycles in preparation for your cycle tour of Hoa Lu. The bicycle tour is a 24km round trip through spectacular scenery of rice fields, karst mountains and quaint rural villages. Leaving the restaurant you will pass glowing lime kilns used by locals to extract lime from the nearby mountains.



Hoa Lu is the site of the former capital of the Vietnamese state, post Chinese rule in the first millennium. The site was chosen for its geographic location, which made it virtually impenetrable and served as the capital from AD 968 until it was moved to present day Hanoi in 1011. Though nothing remains of the capital, the attraction is the raw beauty, the temples dating back to the 17th Century, the King's Tomb and the simple life of the farmers in the region.

On completion of the cycle tour you will return to your hotel to have a cool drink, wash and dinner. You may want to have a look at local markets where you will see typical Vietnamese trading without the tourists.



# Day 2 Ninh Binh - Kenh Ga - Cuc Phuong

Over breakfast you will have the opportunity to discuss the days activities with your guide. A 21km bicycle ride will take you through striking rural scenery. Once you arrive in the floating village of Kenh Ga your guide will organise a private boat. Many travellers to Kenh Ga justifiably refer to the area as Halong Bay with rice fields, but for others, there's no comparison; the magnificent natural beauty of the town's surroundings knows no equal. Still largely undiscovered, Kenh Ga remains an amazing site to explore without the distractions of flocks of tourists.

This part of the trip is an opportunity, not only to visit the floating village but also to see the spectacular limestone mountains that jut out from the rice fields and the river that gently meanders through them. You will also be

charmed by the smiling, waving children, and have an opportunity to explore a water carved cave featuring thousands of year of mineral and rock formations.

After your tour of Kenh Ga a vehicle will transport you back to Ninh Binh for lunch. Following this you will drive the 45km to Cuc Phuong National Park. On the way you will pass pineapple plantations, ethnic minority groups, beautiful scenery and rural villages. Arriving at the gates at Cuc Phuong National Park will give you the opportunity to view the Visitor Information Centre which will highlight features of the park including the numerous hikes on offer, ethnic minority groups, the Endangered Primate Rescue Centre and rare wildlife.

The late afternoon provides the best time to take one of the short treks through the park such as the Thousand Year Old Tree trek. These walks vary in difficulty and your guide can match you up with the right trek depending upon how active you are feeling. Following your close-up experience with the nature in Vietnam you can retire to your accommodation in the National Park.


# Day 3 Cuc Phuong - Hanoi

After breakfast you will drive to the Cave of Prehistoric Man where locals still pay homage to the prehistoric artifacts that have been found in the cave.

Departing the National Park you will have the rare opportunity for a guided tour of the Endangered Rescue Primate Centre by one of the resident German zoologists. In the centre are 15 of Vietnam's 25 species of primates including the extremely rare Cat Ba Langur. The primates are brought to the centre for rehabilitation before being set free in the National Park.



Driving back to Ninh Binh will take you through the spectacular scenery of Hoa Lu before lunch in one of the local restaurants, after which the bus will take you back to Hanoi.

Waking to the tranquil beauty of the bay from the comfort of your cabin is a memorable experience. Magnificent Halong Bay, with its 3,000 islands rising from the emerald waters of the Gulf of Tonkin, is one of the natural wonders of Vietnam and now a World Heritage site. Enjoy the bay from a private junk with opportunities to swim in secluded lagoons and feast on delicious meals prepared by the cook.

# Day 1 Halong Bay, Junk overnight

This morning you are collected at around 8.30am by your guide for the 4 hour drive to Halong Bay. En route there will be a short stop at the Sao Do centre run for and by handicapped children. On arrival we board our private boat, enjoy a sumptuous seafood lunch on board while cruising through thousands of limestone karsts within this World Heritage site.

There is an opportunity to swim in the bay's emerald waters, explore caves with incredible formations of stalactites and stalagmites and enjoy the tranquility of this bay of wonders. We spend the night in on board our boat



Rising to the tranquil beauty of the bay you have time for an early morning swim followed by breakfast. This morning we continue to discover the natural beauty of the Bay along the way to Cat Ba island where you have the options of visiting the national park, trekking over to Viet Hai fishing village by 15km forest road, taking a boat trip to Monkey island or simply lazing the day away on nearby beaches. We spend the night in the island



# Day 3 Ha Noi

We spend the morning free at leisure, A popular option is to hire a motorbike and take a photographic trip around the Island before boarding a hydrofoil for the sea port city of Hai Phong. Here we transfer to our vehicle for a 2-hour journey back to Hanoi.





#### **INTRODUCTION**

Are you going to Saigon and wondering what there is to do there? We recommend to you the Mekong Delta as Saigon's most visited site. This trip mixes sightseeing with cultural exchange. You will have a memorable time with the hospitable people of the Mekong Delta by staying overnight at a local homestay

The 2-day trip offers a glimpse into the agrarian life of the vibrant southern Delta region as we wind our way through the tributaries of the Mekong River. From our boats, we are able to closely observe the daily rituals of river life and participate in the bustling commercial activities as we buy our fruits from the floating market. Along the way, we will visit an orchard farm, handicraft village, and a land market with an abundance of colorful fresh fruits and vegetables.

## **ITINERARY**

# Day 1: Sai Gon - Mekong Delta

This morning we set off for a drive through the Mekong Delta to the town of Cai Be, well-known for it's floating market. Here we will board our private boat for a cruise along the maze of waterways and canals to Vinh Long. We will stop at the home of a Bonsai gardener for a sumptuous Delta lunch, including the popular dish of 'Elephant ear fish' before continuing our exploration of the tributaries and canals of the delta. Towards the end of the day we arrive the home of a local family whose house is built on stilts over the water. These people will be our hosts for this evening and will tell us more about life in the Delta.





# **Day 2: Floating market**

Rising early to the sounds of the Delta coming to life for another day, we have breakfast and start our trip with a boat cruise on sparking streams along the endless waterway of Mighty Mekong River to visit more floating markets. There will be hundreds of boats loaded with fruits, vegetables and fish jostling for trade. Sellers advertise their wares by crying out across the waters. We visit the lush orchards and are treated to a delicious tropical fruits. Afternoon drive back to Ho Chi Minh city.



## INTRODUCTION

Sometimes referred to as Ba Be national park, Ba Be lakes in Bac Kan province is the largest natural fresh water lake in Vietnam, The beautiful region is a tropical rain forest area that covers more than 23,000 hectares, including waterfalls, rivers, deep valleys, lakes, and caves which make it a picturesque landscape. The surrounding area is home to members of the Tay minority, who live in stilt houses.

A marvelous boat trip on clear water, contemplating the wonderful untouched nature surrounded with bamboo clusters, lianas and flowers along the riverside, watch the fishermen in their pirogues and trek to the hill tribe villages in the dense jungle will give you an unforgettable experience

# Day 1: Hanoi - Ba Be lakes

Early this morning you will be picked up at your hotel to leave for Ba Be. On the way, stop to take photos of panorama of the countryside and meet hill tribe people, have lunch in Bac Can, visit home electric dam and Tay village along the way...

Arrive in Ba Be in the afternoon. Free time to relax

# Day 2: Ba Be Lakes

Today we embark on a boat cruising down the Nang River which is the main water source of the lake. This exciting river trip will give us a taste of the tranquil countryside and an enjoyable exploration of the Ba Be National Park. We traverse the Poong Grotto en route before stopping at some nearby hill tribe villages and getting off the beaten track to the scenic Dau -






Dang Waterfalls. In one of the desolated villages near the water you'll spend the night in a traditional Tay house.

Back to Hanoi. More stops on the way at minority villages. Visit the Vietnam Minority People Museum in Thai Nguyen. Arrive in Hanoi at 15h00. End tour.


# Day 1 Ha Long Bay, Junk overnight


